ELIGIBILITY

Children eligible to participate in Middle School CFK *must have completed grades 6, 7, or 8 and for Elementary School CFK must have completed grades 3, 4, or 5, and have been identified by their school for high potential programs or recommended by a teacher, principal, counselor, or gifted program coordinator as one who could benefit from a program for high potential students.*

All children possess talents and gifts. Some children, however, by virtue of outstanding abilities, high motivation and/or strong interest are capable of exceptional performances and achievement in the following areas: general intellectual activities, creative thinking, leadership, visual and performing arts. *Rochester College for Kids* is designed for those students. The program will attempt to challenge, develop and nurture these talents by providing enriching and stimulating learning opportunities. Class experiences are planned to utilize the unique facilities of a college campus and the surrounding area.

SCHEDULE

Three **Half Day Camps** of *Rochester College for Kids* will be offered this summer: for Middle School students, grades 6, 7, or 8, August 6-10 from 8:15 AM - 12:00 PM; for Elementary School students, grades 3, 4, or 5, August 6-10 from 8:15 AM – 12:00 PM **AND** 12:15 PM – 4:00 PM. All half-day classes will be held in Rochester on the University Center - Rochester campus. Students will enroll in one class. Elementary students may sign up for the morning, afternoon or both sessions.

TUITION

The tuition for Rochester College for Kids 2007 **Half Day Camps** is **\$150.00** per child per session.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A **scholarship fund** has been established through area businesses and service organizations. Awards will be determined on a need-basis and given on a first-come, first-serve basis with amounts pro-rated according to income guidelines. **Donations to this fund are always appreciated.**

COURSE SELECTION

Make your course selection carefully. Be certain you have chosen classes scheduled for the correct week and correct grade level. Every attempt will be made to give students their first choice. It is recommended that children do not take classes they have had previously.

REFUND/CANCELLATION POLICY

Refunds will be given for cancellations received by the RCTC Community & Youth Programs Office prior to July 1, 2007 less \$20 that will be retained to cover administrative handling. No refunds will be given after July 1, 2007 except for documented health or emergency reasons. Full refunds will be given if RCTC must cancel the class.

TRANSPORTATION

This is a non-residential program. Students must live within commuting distance or make other arrangements to stay with family or friends. Parents are responsible for transportation.

BEHAVIOR POLICY

In order to meet with the goals of *Rochester College for Kids* it is imperative that students respect the rights of others to learn. Any child who exhibits disruptive behavior in class or during break will be given a warning to cease and the parent(s)/guardian(s) will be notified. If this warning is not heeded the child will be dismissed from *Rochester College for Kids* and the parent(s)/guardian(s) notified. Please discuss this policy with your child.

STAFF

Each class will be taught by college faculty, licensed instructors or other qualified personnel. Classes are designed to allow for a maximum of individualized attention and instruction.

ALL classes for the Half-Day program are held on the University Center – Rochester Campus located at 851 30th Ave SE. Students will start each day with announcements in the Hill Theater. They will also gather in the Hill Theater for dismissal. **Parents - please discuss with your child if you will be picking them up in the Hill Theater or at the Atrium main entrance.** Students picked up at the Atrium main entrance will be escorted by Security Personnel who remain with the students at all times. VOLUNTEER LEADERS

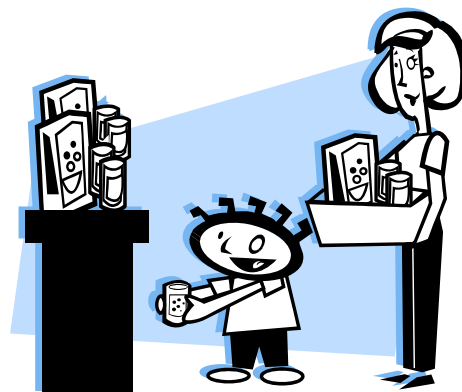

INSTRUCTOR

“Amazing Atoms”

Margaret Pellegrini

Learn the fundamentals of high school chemistry through games and hands-on materials. We will use the Friendly Chemistry curriculum to explore atomic structure, electron “clouds,” basic quantum mechanics and the characteristics of various families of elements and the reasons why they vary. We will also learn forms of notation to specify atomic and electron structure. Helpful if students have completed seventh grade math. Weather permitting, some of our games will take place outdoors. We may be tasting various edible chemicals, so please note any allergies or food restrictions on the registration form.

MIDDLE SCHOOL ONLY – MORNING

“The Big World of WHY?”

Have you ever wondered why you should pick up your room or be nice to other people? Why isn’t your art in a museum? What will the world be like when you are older? What should it be like? Why should it be that way? Does it really matter if you eat your vegetables or watch too much T.V.? What’s the big deal about money? Why are you who you are and not somebody else? Do you love to solve problems while working with others in a unique and creative way? This is the class for you!! Students will explore their problem solving skills by participating in hands-on math activities. Think about math in a fun and challenging way! Students will be measuring, finding the area of a kite pattern, making and flying a kite; take a candy bar challenge to discover the dimensions, size, and characteristics of a candy bar; and work on challenging puzzles like tangrams and pentominoes. There will be many pretend situations including a restaurant and shopping spree that uses their estimation, addition, finding the tip and tax of a bill, and creative problem-solving strategies! We will have group discussions in which you, the students create the topics, then share and analyze your ideas in new and creative ways. Impress your parents and teachers with how insightful you can be, and impress yourself with how enjoyable it can be to think!

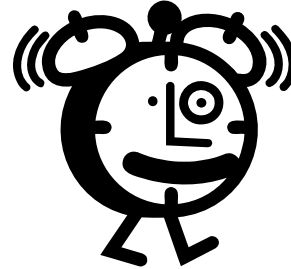
