- B. COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is the third class in a four-semester sequence required for some music majors. The course begins with a review of diatonic chord progressions and modulation, followed by Chromatic Harmony including secondary dominant and leading tone chords, Neapolitan-sixth chords, Augmented-sixth chords, Chromatic modulation techniques, Binary and Ternary form, Theme and Variation technique, Sonata form, Rondo form, instrumental transposition. Sight Singing and Ear Training are included in the course.

 - 1. Review of Diatonic Harmony
 - a) Scales, keys, triads and progressions
 - b) Diatonic Modulation

 - a) Binary and Ternary forms through analysis and composition
 - b) Identifying these forms aurally
 - 3. Chromatic Harmony
 - a) Secondary dominant and leading-tone chords
 - b) Tonicization and chromatic modulation through analysis and part writing
 - c) Singing and dictating secondary dominants and leading-tone chords; tonicizations and modulations
 - 4. Augmented 6th, Neapolitan, and borrowed chords
 - a) Recognizing these chords through analysis
 - b) Part writing and composition including these chords
 - c) Singing and dictating these chords.
 - 5. Sonata, rondo, fugue, and theme and variation forms
 - a) Identifying these forms by analysis, composition, and listening
 - b) Singing and dictating melodies and rhythms found in these forms
